

It is not the facts of the New Testament in their precise form, it is not the exegetical harmony of its truths in their occasions and in their details, that are the power working salvation among men. These may be settled in one way or in another way, or not settled at all; they may conform to this opinion or to that opinion, - or be amenable to no opinion, the real redemptive forces of the world are not thereby altered. The redemption of society does not depend on the exact ways in which spiritual truth has been brought to us, but on the truth itself; it is not, therefore, materially affected by the range of uncertainty that pertains to the method simply.
